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Snappy Original Title with All Major Words Capitalized

Notice that there is only **one** set of double spacing between the paper's title and the first line of the text. Note that the text is indented one half inch to indicate the beginning of the first paragraph. Every new paragraph that follows throughout the paper will also be indented one half inch. Notice that **everything** is double-spaced, with spacing before and after paragraphs **set at 0 pt**. No extra spaces between heading, title, and first paragraph; no fancy formatting on title; **no extra spaces between paragraphs**. In the header, students should type their last name and then insert page number, not just type the page number in. This text is 12pt Times New Roman font.

Also take note that the paper calls for a snappy original title with only the major words capitalized. This means that the writer must think of a clever, meaningful, insightful, and/or snappy title. Literary Analysis Paper or Personal Narrative will not do the trick. Good titles take some time to compose: allow yourself that time.

Note that per Windsor High School English Department Policy, papers that do not follow exact MLA formatting will be returned ungraded. The first time this happens, I will give your paper back and ask that you bring it to me corrected next class. If it occurs a second time, you will receive a 10% deduction off your paper's final grade. A third time = 50% deduction. Paying attention to detail is an important life skill. I promise.
